#### PUBLIC COMMENTS

Martha Garber reported on Badin Historic Museum. A Montgomery County group offered to re-landscape the museum with native, low maintenance plants. The believed original train car that ran from Badin to Halls Junction in the 1920s, called the Spark Plug is being restored. The museum is creating a virtual town tour, and will be selling fundraiser pies and cookies.

Sylvia Rushing of 81 Falls Rd said the burned quadruplex unit beside her has animals getting inside and the burn smell is inside her home. She would like to see something done.

Rodney Page of 83 Falls Rd. was affected by the fire at 85 Falls Rd. It's not boarded, and they're getting water in their house. The in-ground pool at 85 Falls Rd. is seldom attended. Dust blows in through the roof. NCDEQ won't assess residential property. He said insurance released it July 25<sup>th</sup>, and asked what enforcement steps are being taken. Almond said town was limited on code enforcement during the insurance investigation, but council has opened a code case. Page thanked the fire department for their work fighting the fire.

Ward pointed out the last sentence on the leaf collection schedule was cut off.

Martha Garber asked if electronics would be collected with ERI gone. Almond said they will.

#### **POLICE REPORT:**

• Chief Smith reported 2,187 calls for service in September.

Almond said the vehicles will have striping removed and cleaned. Public Works and Police Department will get items ready for auction.

#### FINANCIAL REPORT:

Almond presented financial report ending October 10, 2025. September revenues from property tax, sales & use tax and occupancy tax. Almond said the code enforcement line item will increase with case progress.

## **MANAGER'S REPORT:**

Almond reported the following:

- 1. Staff sent a letter to NCDPR committing to restroom provision concurrent with Phase 1 of the Waterfront Park project and currently awaiting revised scope approval. Staff and council are exploring restroom options.
- 2. Completed storm water projects: Stanly St. ditch, Walnut St ditch, Storm drain at Cheoah and Tallassee streets, Outfall at Lincoln and Sherman streets. Pending storm water projects: 702 Roosevelt (Marion St. to Sherman St.)
- 3. Trees removed: Nantahala/Boyden St., Sherman/Grant St., Maple/Spruce St. Stumps and sidewalks at all locations pending.
- 4. Almond met with IBTS and 321 Grant St. property owner today to determine case plan. Case opened on 85 Falls Rd. Title searches completed on other properties.
- 5. New website designs with new features expected by mid to late October.
- 6. Badin Town Hall will be closed November 11, 2025 in observance of Veteran's Day.
- 7. The next Regular Council meeting will be 7 p.m., Nov. 10, 2025 in Badin Town Hall.

# **COUNCIL COMMENTS:**

Huntley spoke with the owner of 321 Washington St. and they requested 90 days to clean lot and sow grass. Council consensus to allow 90 days.

C. Council said there is supposed to be a fine when limb and brush is put out right after collection. Almond said the plan was to wait a week or two and notice everyone at once for better results. C. Council said they did a nice job on Lincoln and Sherman streets storm water project and hopes they can do something about 85 Falls Rd.

Rife proposed a council work session October 28 to share restroom options for the park.
