PUBLIC COMMENTS

CVB Director Kacey Brooks greeted council. The new CVB website will add a town events page.

Windstream Utility Project Coordinator Wayne Clemmons and Engineering Manager Joel Smith greeted council. Ward noted lines need moving to new poles. Smith said that and line/pole removal from waterfront park are on the way.

Mayor Lowder called the meeting to order.

Discussion: Huntley asked about site furnishings, benches for Badin Waterfront Park. Almond

said PARTF requires four benches and confirmed they are handled.

Motion to approve October 3, 2024 Emergency meeting minutes: Ward

Discussion: C. Council asked if Randy Bush knows about Alcoa parking lot drain. Almond said

he expects to revisit it once FEMA trucks are out of the parking lot.

BUSINESS

Council considered marking Falls Rd. from Boyden St. to NC 740 in Central Business District. NCDOT approved town's striping proposal and will include it in the resurfacing contract. Almond met with striping contractor Lynn Howell and expects an estimate Monday.

Council reviewed ARPA ordinance assigning funds to salaries and benefits to close the grant.

Motion to accept the ARPA ordinance as written: Huntley

Second: Chambers

Vote: Passed/Unanimous

Council discussed PARTF grant requirements for the waterfront park. Lowder presented picnic tables, grills, and trash cans for Miles McClellan to review for PARTF approval. Ward agreed and suggested more vendors. C. Council suggested a timeline of the end of October. Consensus is to email submittals to Almond so he can email a consolidated list to everyone.

Castleberry Paving plans to start Spruce Street by end of October, followed by part of Pine St.

Ward said work restarted on Spruce St. ditch, and regrown weeds and bamboo need attention.

Council discussed West Badin Park restroom grant. Lowder said \$16,000 to spend on drawing and sewer tap. Stanly County Parks grant approved it for 2024/2025 reimbursable grant funds.

Council reviewed Town of Badin Ordinance 12-2 governing town right-of-way. Huntley commented on clippings on sidewalks forcing people to avoid, and clippings in roads causing storm drain issues. C. Council said it causes sidewalk grass growth public works has to spray and ends up collecting in storm drains. Ward said we can talk about other stuff left on right-of-ways. At 32 Hickory and Poplar, they're putting stuff on the curb and right-of-way on three sides. It's been reported but not enforced. There's a swimming pool and equipment and construction debris in piles. After getting notified, they should have ten days. Lowder said he talked to the group doing it. It was out a few weeks too early for town cleanup. Ward said some stuff was out there two months. We have people riding the streets. They should see it and address it. They're also mowing the right-of-way, which is the town's work. Almond said right-of-way can overlap private property which could amount to a homeowner mowing grass they own within the right-of-way. Lowder mentioned a lot of public nuisance problems have been successfully addressed by the Chief of Police. Council discussed housing code. C. Council wants ideas from IBTS. Almond is awaiting council list, and will meet with IBTS.

PUBLIC WORKS:

Miller reported the following:

- Next limb/brush collection November 5, 2024.
- 15 Loads of brush for October.
- Town Cleanup collection starts next week.
- Leaf schedule starts in November.

Ward mentioned standing water after the rain on Wood/Lee streets and a spot on Lincoln Street.

POLICE REPORT:

• Chief Smith reported 2,370 calls for service in September.

FINANCIAL REPORT:

Almond presented financial report ending Oct. 4, 2024. September revenue from property tax, sales & use tax, occupancy tax. Almond said will probably need a budget amendment for code enforcement. C. Council requested each member of council and public works report worst code violations. Huntley suggested a special meeting for code and nuisance violations and the park.
